Need of the Nurse led Triage System:

50% of preventable death and disability burden contributed by LMIC (low-middle income countries). This can be reduced with quality resilient 3R's System- quick Recognition, prompt Resuscitation and early Referral (if needed). The curbing delay in first R can reduce mortality and morbidity at large extent. Nurses play vital role in quick recognition of the emergency and first point of contact with the patient in emergency department. Therefore, WHO CCET advocating Nurse Led Triage in India and SEAR.
